

Last will and Testament of  
Frederick Bealer

In the Name of God Amen.

I Frederick Bealer of Westfallandfield Township  
Lawford County, State of Pa being infirm in body  
but of sound mind and memory thanks be to  
God. for the same. and knowing of the uncertainty  
of life and Certainty of death. desire to  
say how my property shall be disposed of  
after my death. do make this my last  
will and Testament hereby revoking  
and making void all former wills by me  
at any time heretofore made.

1<sup>st</sup> I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Jane  
all my household Goods excepting the organ  
which I bequeath to my daughter Maggie Marshall

2<sup>d</sup> I will & bequeath to my beloved wife Jane  
and son Charles S. Bealer all my moveable  
and mixed property also the farm I now  
reside upon in Westfallandfield Township above  
Co & State containing about one hundred acre  
out of which they are to pay all my just debts  
purchase and place over my grave a fair  
tombstone or monument. and by paying the  
following bequests as named below the farm  
will be theirs

3<sup>d</sup> Pay my daughter Maggie Marshall. four  
Hundred Dollars (\$400<sup>00</sup>) and pay to each

Calvin <sup>4</sup>Louise Hoobler and <sup>5</sup>Almira Burge  
and in case of the death of any of the above  
named. Theirs heirs to get their share. —  
as to my son Henry Bealer I have already  
sent him one hundred dollars. his  
Note is to be delivered up to him which  
will be equal to giving him same as to the  
other before named. Sons.

all of the aforesaid bequeaths are to be paid  
inside of one year after my death without  
Interest

~~Section~~ to my beloved wife and son Charles I to run  
the place as best they can as if Equal  
Partners, <sup>(she to share with Charles)</sup> in profits and after all debt  
& bequeaths are paid. my wife Jane's interest  
is to be sum in case of resolution removal  
or death to be One Thousand Dollars —  
besides the Household goods all of  
which she can dispose of as she wishes  
and her interest to remain in the farm  
until she withdraws it or disposes of it  
and as this is to be her Jane's home my son Charles  
must see that she is made comfortable  
& that she Jane can dispose by will of her interest  
& should they both that is my wife Jane & son  
Charles. desire to sell out & Bury Ed  
where they can but Jane's interest in  
any property will be first forth <sup>concerning</sup>  
the interlining between 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> line in section 4. before signing  
th I do hereby name select and appoint —

J. M. Lott as my Executor to  
Execute this my last will and Testament  
In testimony I, the testator Frederick Bealer  
do sign my name and affix my seal  
this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of September A.D. 1895 in
